New Life In Christ

We Were Created in the Image of God

The creation of man

Genesis 1:26-27

"Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth.' So God created man in His *own* image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them."

God and Man in Fellowship

When God said "Let Us make man in Our image..." this was a conversation between the three members of the Trinity - the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. As a result, we were created with a spirit, a soul and a body. Before Adam and Eve sinned, there was perfect fellowship between them and God because they had both physical life and spiritual life. There was no separation between God and man.

The choices facing man

Genesis 2:16-17

"And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, 'Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

God gave man the choice to obey and live or disobey and die. That choice involved both physical and spiritual death. Spiritual death is the separation of man from God. We will see that spiritual death happened immediately as soon as man sinned. Physical death is the separation of the body from the soul and spirit. That happens at the time of physical death. The soul and spirit go immediately to heaven or hell.

Man Chose to Sin

The choice man made

Genesis 3:1-6

"Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, 'Has God indeed said, "You shall not eat of every tree of the garden"?' And the woman said to the serpent, 'We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; but of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God has said, "You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die." Then the serpent said to the woman, 'You will not surely die. For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.' So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate."

Satan's attacks

he questioned the Word of God he called God a liar

three ways we are tempted Genesis 3:6

- 1. the lust of the flesh the woman saw that the tree was good for food
- 2. the lust of the eyes and that it was pleasant to the eyes
- 3. **the pride of life** *and a tree* to be *desirable to make one wise*

1 John 2:15-17

"Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

For all that *is* in the world — <u>the</u> <u>lust of the flesh</u>, <u>the lust of the</u> <u>eyes</u>, and <u>the pride of life</u> — is not of the Father but is of the world.

And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever."

Separation from God


Genesis 3:8

Separation from God (and each other) "And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. Then the LORD God called to Adam and said to him, 'Where are you?" Fear "So he said, 'I heard Your voice in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself." Guilt "And He said, 'Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you that you should not eat?" Blame "Then the man said, 'The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I ate.' And the LORD God said to the woman, 'What is this you have done?' The woman said, 'The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

Sin caused abandonment and separation from one another

Psalm 27:10

"When my father and my mother forsake me, Then the LORD will take care of me."

"Where do wars and fights *come* from among you? Do *they* not *come* from your *desires* for pleasure that war in your members? You lust and do not have. You murder and covet and cannot obtain. You fight and war. Yet you do not have because you do not ask."

fear anger hurt resentment distrust loneliness sadness

One of the spiritual consequences of sin is the fact that it not only separates us from God, it also separates us from each other. This separation causes abandonment and fear. When we turn that fear outward, it becomes anger. When we turn our fear inward, it becomes hurt. Anger will produce resentment and distrust while hurt will produce loneliness and sadness. The following list gives us some common forms of abandonment.



Hebrews 2:17


"Therefore, in all things He had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people."




To Accept Christ's Payment, We Must Repent of Our Sin




Repentance is a change of mind that produces a change of actions


1 Thessalonians 1:9

Understanding Saving Faith

Saving Faith is believing that Christ died for your sins, believing that God raised Christ from the dead, and choosing to depend on Christ's payment for your sin and not your own efforts to be right with God. In includes three parts:

1. **A firm persuasion** based on hearing that what God has said about Christ and His death and resurrection are true. - 1 Corinthians 15:3-6

"For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve. After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep."

2. **A personal surrender** to Him. - John 1:12

"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name."

3. A new walk produced by such a surrender. - 2 Corinthians 5:7

"For we walk by faith, not by sight."

The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men— extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."


Trying to Change Before We Became Christians

Reason why non-Christians have little or no desire to change

Ephesians 2:1

"And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins."

A spiritually dead person

has no desire to change has no power to change

Carnal Christians have a desire to change but no power to change

Romans 7:14-25

"For we know that the law is spiritual, but <u>I</u> am carnal, sold under sin. For what <u>I</u> am doing, <u>I</u> do not understand. For what <u>I</u> will to do, that <u>I</u> do not practice; but what <u>I</u> hate, that <u>I</u> do. If, then, <u>I</u> do what <u>I</u> will not to do, <u>I</u> agree with the law that *it is* good. But now, *it is* no longer <u>I</u> who do it, but sin that dwells in <u>me</u>. For <u>I</u> know that in <u>me</u> (that is, in <u>my</u> flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with <u>me</u>, but *how* to perform what is good <u>I</u> do not find. For the good that <u>I</u> will *to do*, <u>I</u> do not do; but the evil <u>I</u> will not *to do*, that <u>I</u> practice. Now if <u>I</u> do what <u>I</u> will not *to do*, it is no longer <u>I</u> who do it, but sin that dwells in <u>me</u>. I find then a law, that evil is present with <u>me</u>, the one who wills to do good. For <u>I</u> delight in the law of God according to the inward man. But <u>I</u> see another law in <u>my</u> members, warring against the law of <u>my</u> mind, and bringing <u>me</u> into captivity to the law of sin which is in <u>my</u> members. <u>O wretched man that I am!</u> Who will deliver <u>me</u> from this body of death? <u>I</u> thank God -- through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, with the mind <u>I myself</u> serve the law of God, but with the flesh the law of sin."

A Christian depending on his or her own strength

Change Happens Through the Power of the Holy Spirit

Change cannot happen through our own strength


John 15:5

"I am the vine, you *are* the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for <u>without Me you can do nothing</u>."

We grieve and quench the Holy Spirit when we depend on our own strength.

Ephesians 4:30 "And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption."



Romans 8:14

Change Happens As We Know, Reckon and Yield

We must know that our old man is crucified with Christ Romans 6:6

"Knowing this, that our old man was crucified with *Him*, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin."



1 Peter 2:24

"Who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed."

We must <u>reckon</u> (rely on) the fact that we are dead to the control of sin and alive to the control of God in Christ

Romans 6:11

"Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

"reckon" means to know our sins were put to the account of Christ and He paid for them on the cross


dead to the power of sin through Christ alive to the power of God

We are now free to yield to the control of God

Romans 6:13, 16



Galatians 5:22-23


"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law."

Romans 12:2


"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

Matthew 26:39




Why God Forgives Our Sin

The meaning of forgiveness

the Greek word translated forgive aphiemi - #863 in Strong's Concordance meaning:

to send away to let go to give up a debt to forgive

Understanding what Christ did for us at the cross

Five things Christ did for us at the moment of salvation

He opened our eyes

He turned us from darkness to light

He turned us from the power of Satan to God

We received forgiveness of sins

We received an inheritance among those who are sanctified by faith in Christ

Micah 7:19


"He will again have compassion on us, And will subdue our iniquities. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea."


The difference between relationship and fellowship



Relationship and Fellowship


God established our relationship with Him by putting us into the body of Christ.

Why We Were Controlled by Fear

At physical birth, we know neither fear or love



However, two things caused us to begin moving toward fear.

1. Our own sin


Genesis 8:21

"And the LORD smelled a soothing aroma. Then the LORD said in His heart, 'I will never again curse the ground for man's sake, although the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth; nor will I again destroy every living thing as I have done."

2. The sins of others

Genesis 6:5

"Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually."



As a result, our lives became controlled by fear

Hebrews 2:14-15



Grow in our understanding of the love of Christ for us

Romans 8:35-39

"Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? *Shall* tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written: 'For Your sake we are killed all day long; We are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.' Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Grow in our understanding of our position in Christ



Change Does Not Happen Through Our Own Efforts

Change cannot happen through outward effort

Colossians 2:20-23

"Therefore, if you died with Christ from the basic principles of the world, why, as though living in the world, do you subject yourselves to regulations — 'Do not touch, do not taste, do not handle,' which all concern things which perish with the using — according to the commandments and doctrines of men? These things indeed have an appearance of wisdom in self-imposed religion, false humility, and neglect of the body, but are of no value against the indulgence of the flesh."

Understanding Why Roots Are the Key to Change

Scripture also gives the root cause of sin - unbelief, which separates man from the love of God






Understanding How a Root of Bitterness Affects Us


This bitterness can even affect those who claim to be Christians




Love of money and covetousness robs us of contentment

Moving From Bitterness to Forgiveness

Remember what Christ did to break the power of sin over us

1 Peter 2:24

"Who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed."

Remember how Christ has forgiven us

Luke 23:34a

"Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."

Realize that we have been commanded to forgive one another

Ephesians 4:30-32

"And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you."

Repent of our unwillingness to forgive

Acts 8:22-23

"Repent therefore of this your wickedness, and pray God if perhaps the thought of your heart may be forgiven you. For I see that you are poisoned by bitterness and bound by iniquity."

Remember that we have been given the power to forgive as we yield to God

Romans 6:16

"Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin *leading* to death, or of obedience *leading* to righteousness?"

choices remain bitter forgive remain in experience bondage freedom

John 8:36

"Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed."

Moving From Love of Money to Contentment

Remember that the love of money is a source of much sin

1 Timothy 6:10

"For the love of money is a root of all *kinds of* evil, for which some have strayed from the faith in their greediness, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows."

Realize that God wants our character to be free from the love of money

Hebrews 13:5

"Make sure that your character is free from the love of money, being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, 'I will never desert you, nor will I ever forsake you." (NASB 1995)

Repent for letting the love of money control your life

Acts 8:17-22

"Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. And when Simon saw that through the laying on of the apostles' hands the Holy Spirit was given, he offered them money, saying, 'Give me this power also, that anyone on whom I lay hands may receive the Holy Spirit.' But Peter said to him, 'Your money perish with you, because you thought that the gift of God could be purchased with money! You have neither part nor portion in this matter, for your heart is not right in the sight of God. Repent therefore of this your wickedness, and pray God if perhaps the thought of your heart may be forgiven you."

Remember that contentment is the result of Christian growth

Philippians 4:10-11

"But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at last your care for me has flourished again; though you surely did care, but you lacked opportunity. Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content."




Dealing With Stubborn Sins and Habits
